Cheyenne County 4-H Shooting Sports is hosting a 4-H Shotgun trap and skeet State Match Qualifier in accordance with the 2026 ATA, NSSA, & State 4-H Shooting Sports Rulebook for Kansas.

Note: Only those 4-H age 10 (as of January 1, 2026) and above are eligible to compete at the State Match.

Skeet begins at 8:00am • Trap begins at 8:00am

Check in begins 1 hour prior to first flight in each discipline.

Registration form and fees are due by 5PM July 17, 2026.

Fees are \$25 per shooter per discipline.

Registrations are accepted from one person per county. NO REFUNDS.

Individual awards will be given to the top 3 shooters in each division and top 3 combined Trap teams

Shooters must provide their own shotgun and ammunition.

All shotguns will be approved by Range Officer

Range regulations require that ammunition not exceed 2 ¾ inch, 3 dram, 1 1/8 oz, 7 ½ oz, 8 or 9 shot

ONLY NEW SHELLS WILL BE ALLOWED, NO RELOADS

No barrels resting on toes, foot, or pointed at any part of the body Eye and

Ear Protection Required for anyone past the ready line

Absolutely NO open toe shoes allowed on the range - this includes Crocs
